EU Strategy for the Baltic Sea Region


• First macro-regional strategy;

- Explicitly asks for cooperation and coordination among the Baltic Sea States (MSs and non-EU MSs);
- Needs continuous political support, commitment and ownership;
- EUSBSR is fully aligned with the Europe 2020 Strategy.


