EUSDR is one of the strategic frameworks of the DRP

DRP is one of the financing instruments of the EUSDR

All DRP SOs contribute to the EUSDR PAs / Action Plan

Not all EUSDR PA can be supported by the DRP





What is financed?

DRP supports joint cooperation projects which:

- Develop institutional capacity, ensuring knowledge sharing / transfer
- Support the development of a common framework for policy implementation in various fields
- Support policy harmonisation in various fields
- Develop innovative solutions to common problems
- Pave the way to new investments
- What is NOT supported
 - Pre-dominant focus on infrastructure
 - Pre-dominant focus on <u>research and data collection without translating into applied solutions / policy strategies, plans</u>
 - Pre-dominant focus on <u>technical solution without uptake</u> by target users





Transnational cooperation

transnational dimension:

project topic, addressed challenge and contributing project activities have transnational,
 broader territorial and/or thematic character and relevance

transnational impact:

based on the planned activities and outputs the impact of the project can be considered
 relevant on transnational scale and not only on local level in different parts of the region

A collection of different local actions of PPs under one "umbrella" is not yet transnational





What activities are financed?

- improving policies and institutional capacities (e.g. joint strategies, action plans, policy & sectoral dialogs, networks, trainings)
- developing solutions (e.g. tools, methods, processes, services, database) that are also pilot tested within the project
- pilot actions (testing demonstrating viability and applicability of solutions)
- Information, communication, dissemination activities (supporting the thematic activities)
- transnational small-scale investments (no major infrastructure)

reasonable mix of activities with clear thematic focus

No advance payment of Interreg funds contribution!!!

Project partners need sufficient cash-flow capacities!!!

Reimbursed on periodically reported and validated PP's cost-basis!!!







Partnership

- "INTERREG funds" equal participation of non-EU partners
- at least 3 directly financing partners from 3 DRP countries
 - at least 1 partner from EU Member States
 - Competitive projects to be based on much broader partnerships
- involvement of relevant PPs from DRP non-EU Member States
 - part of quality assessment
- applicants from non-EU Member States can also be lead applicants
- lead partner & project partners only from DRP area
