Short description of the project:	"Citizens of macro-regions for a stronger Europe" is a project building on the still unused potential of a relatively new EU policy-making framework, the macro- regional strategies (MRS). The 10 project participating CSOs from AT, DE, DK, FR, HU, IT, PL, RO, RS and SK cover in balanced manner all the 4 macro- regions: the Baltic Sea, Danube, Adria-Ionian and Alpine Regions.
	The novelty of the project is that it brings together for the first time CSOs from all the macro-regions thereby increasing their potential of influencing macro- and EU-level policy-making processes. This will be achieved by
	a) a joint contribution to the elaboration of the biannual Commission's Report on MRS (released by the end of 2018) and assisting the implementation of its recommendations and
	 b) attending the Annual Forums and other macro-regional programmes of the MRS.
	CSO and citizen involvement is assisted further by organising in public spaces 6 thematic events in 6 different locations:
	1. investing in democracy and values (Paris)
	2. human connectivity (Budapest)
	3. increased voters turnout at the 2019 EP elections (UIm)
	4. creating citizens' friendly EU institutions (Bratislava)
	5. challenging EU scepticism (Milan)
	6. discovering the value of citizens' participation (Bucharest)
	As appropriate the following issues will also be referred to during the debates in a macro-regional context:
	 contribution to citizens understanding of the Union and shaping its future euroscepticism A positive narrative for Europe Active European Citizenship
	Project activities reaching out well beyond the circles of "usual suspects" confirm that MRS can have a bridge-building function and be successful as an interface between the EU institutions and the citizens reducing the distance between them.
